NATIONAL ASSESSMENT PROGRAM - LITERACY & NUMERACY (NAPLAN)

In 2008, the NAPLAN commenced in Australian schools. The program is scheduled to continue in 2010 with all students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 to be assessed using common national tests in Reading, Writing, Language Conventions and Numeracy. The scheduled dates for the tests are Tuesday 11 May, Wednesday 12 May and Thursday 13 May.

The national tests will provide information on how students are progressing against national minimum standards of literacy and numeracy skills expected for each year level. The results will support improvements in teaching and learning.

You will receive an individual report that shows your child's results. The report will indicate how your child performed in comparison to the national average and the levels of achievement expected at that year level.
