PEOPLE IN LUKE

At Geneva we all read from the Bible at some time. We might read it during Assembly or devotions, or even in our offices. But, do we think about how we got the Bible? Who wrote it? Or who it was written for?

I would like to introduce some people to you, who will help you know more about the Bible. In Luke 1:1-4 you will be surprised to see how many people are mentioned in such a few words!

Lets focus on just two people; the first person is whom the book is written for, his name is Theophilus. The second person is who wrote the book, we know him as Luke. What do we know about those two people?

Theophilus' name means "friend of God" and it was important for him to be sure about the things he had heard about Jesus. Luke was concerned for his friend Theophilus. He carefully investigated everything about Jesus by talking to eyewitnesses and by listening to their accounts. After he had done his research, Luke wrote an "orderly account".

Isn't that wonderful news. Here are two friends, and one of them has such a concern for the other that he has carefully investigated and written down the information about Jesus for his friend.

Why did Luke do that? Luke wanted his friend to know the truth about what God and about Jesus. Isn't that a great thing for friends to do? That is one of the greatest gifts of friendship: to make sure our friend knows the truth about Jesus.

Do you know, I think one of the saddest things today, is that many people don't get to know the truth about God and Jesus. Like Luke and Theophilus, one of the best things we can do for our friends; one of the best things we can do for each other is to learn about God, and talk with each other about the things that he has done. - Chris Stafferton

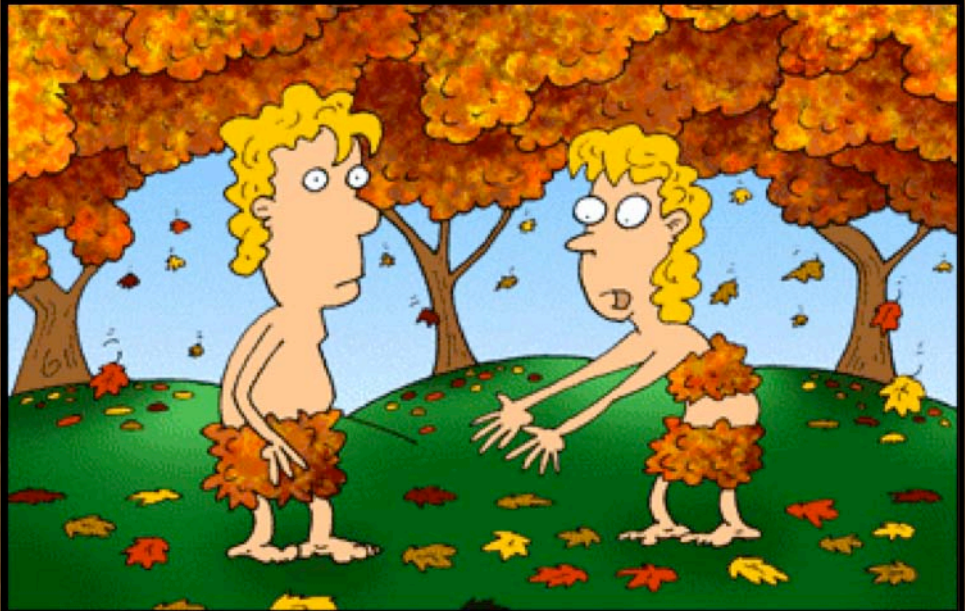
WELCOME
