GIVE 101%

From a strictly mathematical viewpoint - What Equals 100%? What does it mean to give more than 100%? Ever wonder about those people who say they are giving more than 100%? We have all been in situations where someone wants you to give over 100%... How about achieving 101%?

What equals 100% in life? Here's a little mathematical formula that might help answer these questions. If 'A B C D E F G H I J K L M N O P Q R S T U V W X Y Z' is represented as '1 2 3 4 5 6 7 8 9 10 11 12 13 14 15 16 17 18 19 20 21 22 23 24 25 26' then-

$$\text{H-A-R-D-W-O- R- K} = 8+1+18+4+23+15+18+11 = 98\% \text{ and}$$

$$\text{K-N-O-W-L-E- D-G-E} = 11+14+15+23+12+5+4+7+ 5 = 96\% \text{ but}$$

$$\text{A-T-T-I-T-U- D-E} = 1+20+20+9+20+ 21+4+5 = 100\%$$

Then, look how far the love of God will take you!

$$\text{L-O-V-E-O-F- G-O-D} = 12+15+22+5+15+ 6+7+15+4 = \underline{101\%}$$

Therefore, one can conclude with mathematical certainty that: While Hard Work and Knowledge will get you close, and Attitude will get you there, It's the Love of God that will put you over the top!

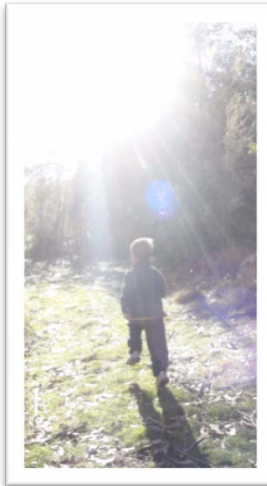
PREP REPORT
