

national tree day

Students in year 3 & 4 planted 17 trees to help form a shelter belt in their school grounds. They planted 2 eucalyptus leucoxylon rosea (pink flowering gum), 3 grevillea rosmarinifolia (red grevillea), 4 melaleuca (tea tree) and 9 acacia melanoxylon (Blackwood). As well as providing a shelter belt at the western end of the school oval the trees will provide new habitat for some of the many birds that live around the school.
