HOW DO YOU HANDLE A CONFLICT

Caring confrontation should be in a a language that reduces stress and anguish. As adults we must become intentional about how we approach conflict and how we deal with conflict, not just with one another but with our children. Our children are both recipients and witnesses to how a stressful situation can be carefully resolved. There are 5 qualities that can help us have caring confrontation with one another and our children: quick, kind, calm, firm and close. Quick means that we are concise with our language and do not go on and on or lecture. Kind means that we are not hot under the collar or angry, while helping our children get back on track. Calm allows the grownups to model appropriate body language so children can mirror those emotions. Being **firm** helps us set a boundary for children through our words of directions, without being cross. And finally, being **close** allows children to save face, they are not embarrassed in front of their peers and this helps eliminate angst against us as adults. Take a look at these directions from God about how we each need to handle or resolve a conflict.


