STUBBORNNESS

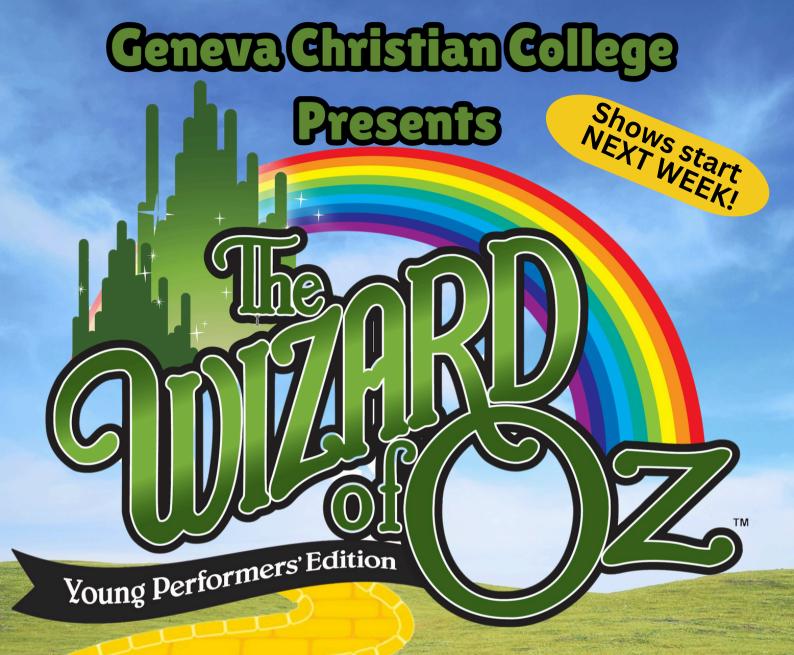
